### *Berberis bealei* - Leatherleaf Mahonia

- Evergreen shrub with late-winter yellow blooms
- Early nectar source for pollinators
- Low-maintenance, deer-resistant, thrives in shade

## In the Garden This Month

# February Gardening Checklist

February is a key month for preparation and planning. While gardens are still mostly dormant, **the tasks you complete now will set the stage for a successful growing season.**

- Dormant prune fruit trees and remove diseased wood; apply dormant sprays as needed.
- Begin the earliest warm-season transplants for early May planting.

- Start seeds for cool-season crops like broccoli, cabbage, and cauliflower (about 8 weeks before transplanting).
- Collect scion wood for grafting and prepare soil for early crops when conditions allow.
- Order remaining garden seeds will available.

### Fruit Tree Tip:

- Success starts with good site selection and disease-resistant cultivars adapted to East Tennessee. Thoughtful choices now prevent long-term issues later.

# Dormant Pruning Basics for Fruit Trees

Dormant pruning improves light, airflow, spray coverage, and fruit production. Train fruit trees to a single central leader with a narrow, cone-shaped canopy.

- Remove large, crowded, damaged, or diseased branches.
- Keep well-spaced, mostly horizontal limbs; remove very upright or drooping branches.
- Use renewal cuts to encourage new, productive growth. [READ MORE](#)
